Rosalyn has extensive experience in data analysis, project management, and mixed-method study design. She received her MPH in Global Epidemiology from Emory University, an MSc in Demography and Health from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and a BA in Anthropology and Psychology from the University of Louisville.
